

Landlocked Zambia is making a spirited push to compete favourably among African economies by tapping the power of solar energy to light up rural homes and drive industry.

Zambia's solar market is poised for significant growth in the next 3-5 years, driven by increasing electricity demand, falling technology costs, and government support for renewable energy.

We set out to explore how rural Zambian people make decisions about whether to adopt solar power or not. Over six months, we interviewed 58 people in three remote rural regions of Zambia.
